Conference Theme: Military Geosciences in the 21st Century: Past Lessons and Modern Challenges

The Conference is being organized on behalf of the Desert Research Institute (DRI, Reno, Nevada), the Department of Geology and Environmental Geosciences, College of Charleston, and the International Association for Military Geosciences (IAMG).

Themes: We seek abstracts that link a wide range of military activities within a broad span of geological, geographical, archeological, suitability, historical, and spatial analysis. A volume of peer-reviewed papers presented at the conference will be published summer of 2023 as a hardcover through Springer.

Abstracts: Abstracts can be submitted to icmgabstracts@dri.edu by March 30th, 2022. Abstracts should include Title, Author(s), 300-500 words, single spaced. Post-Conference Excursion: The theme of the tour will be military history and coastal environments. Day 1: Saturday June 25, 2022: The excursion will begin in Charleston, SC and travel to Southport, NC to visit Fort Fisher.

Day 2: Sunday June 26, 2022: The tour will travel to Wilmington, NC to tour the NC Battleship. In the afternoon, the tour will visit the Bentonville Battlefield Historic Site.

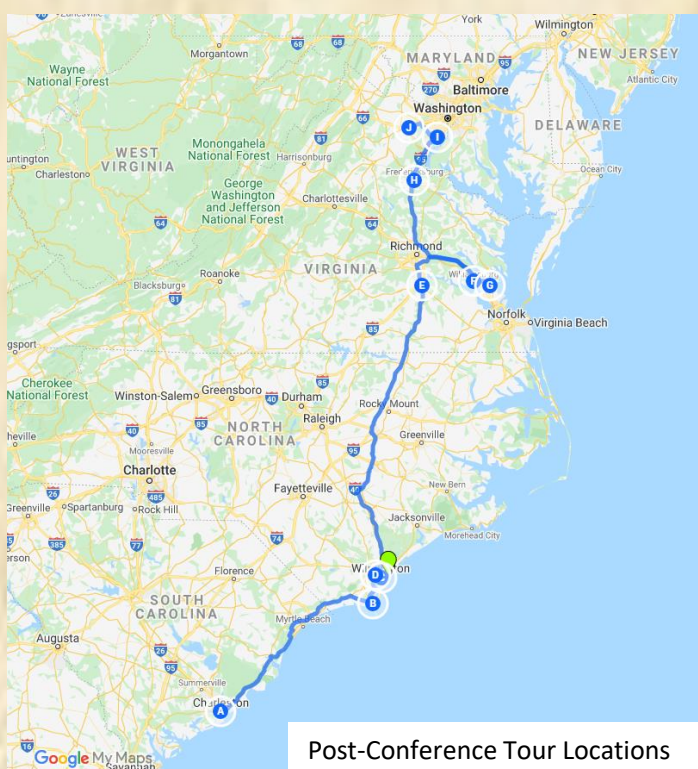

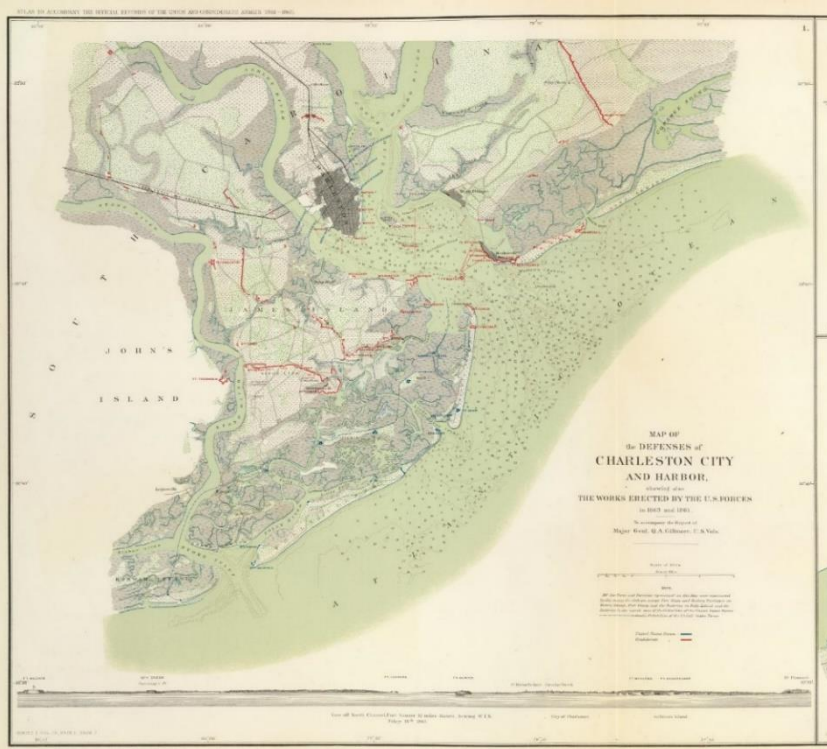
